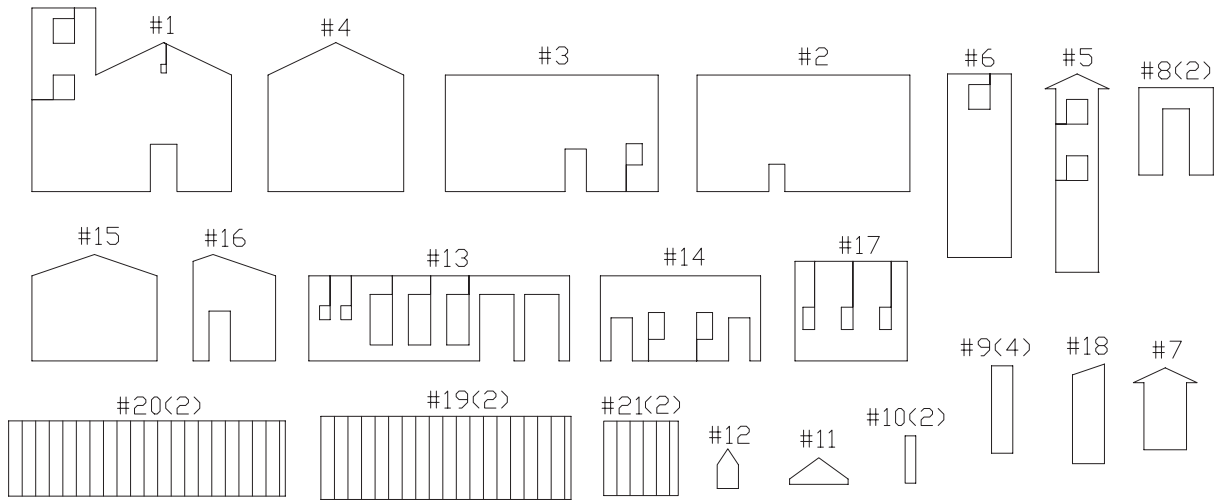


San Jose Instructions

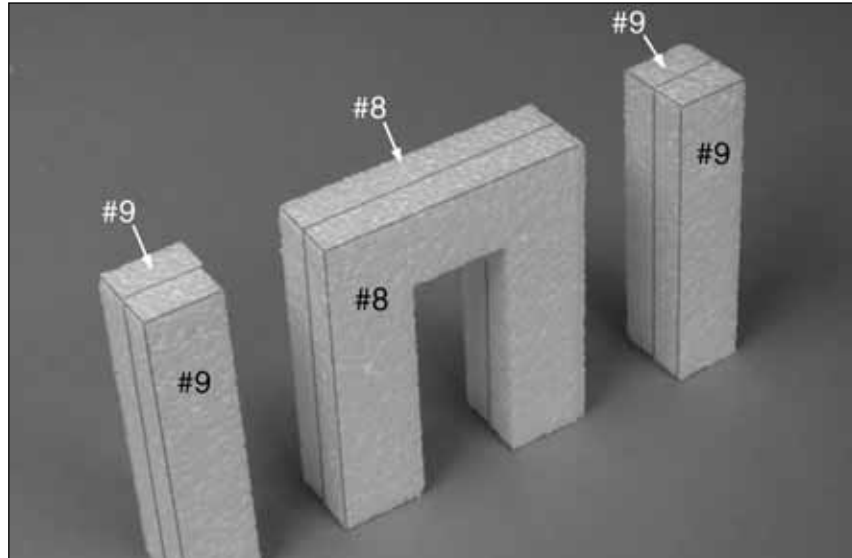
Parts Drawing



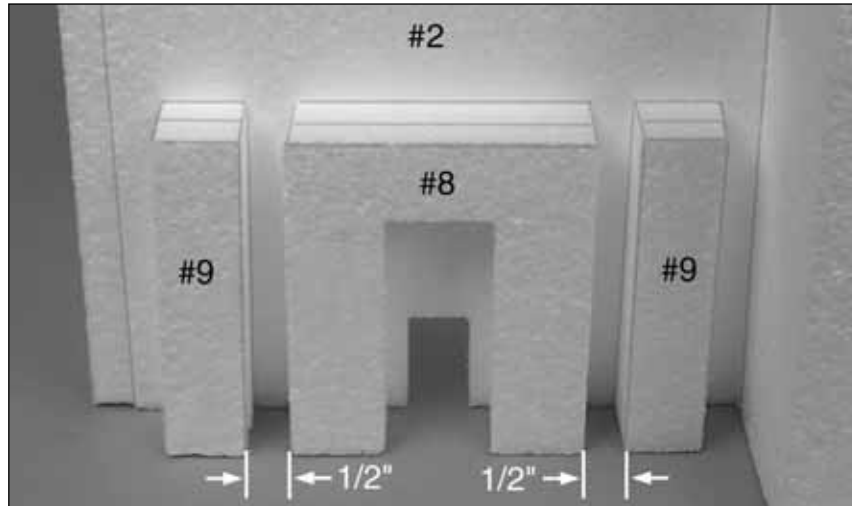
- Before starting assembly, read through each step of the instructions and carefully study each photo. As you put the model together, it is a good idea to "test" fit the pieces together before using any glue.
- Spread out newspaper across the table or desk that you are working on. This will help to protect your work surface.
- Use scissors to trim any pieces where needed. PARENTAL SUPERVISION is recommended.
- Identify each piece of the model by matching it with the parts drawing above.
- Assemble the model with standard white glue. It is a good idea to hold the pieces together with toothpicks until the glue is dry. Once the glue is dry, twist the toothpick and carefully pull it out.
- Use a small brush, flat stick, or your finger to spread glue evenly on the surface.
- Do not glue any of the pieces to the base until after Step 12.

Note: The missions can either be assembled on the cardboard sheet (included) or on a sheet of foam (not included).

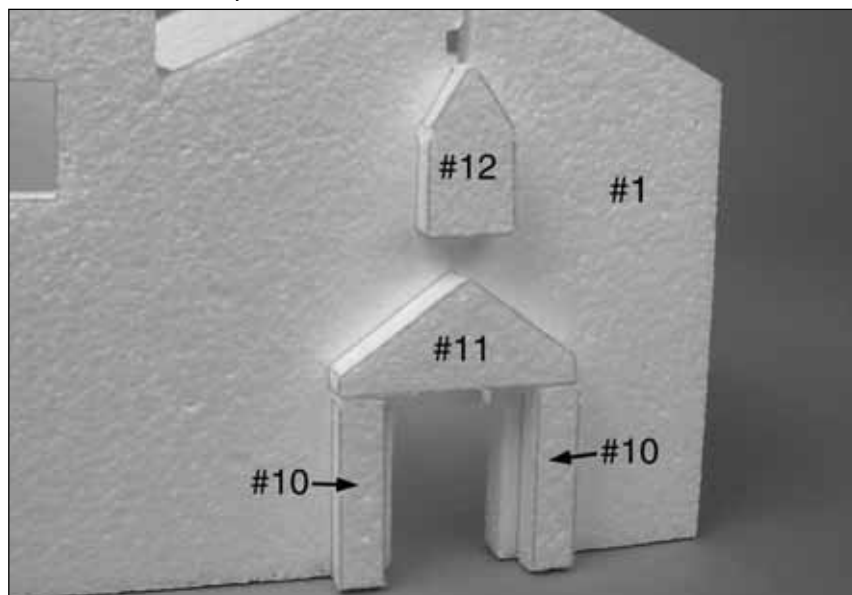
6. Locate the two #8 and four #9 pieces. Glue them together as shown below. Make sure all edges are even.



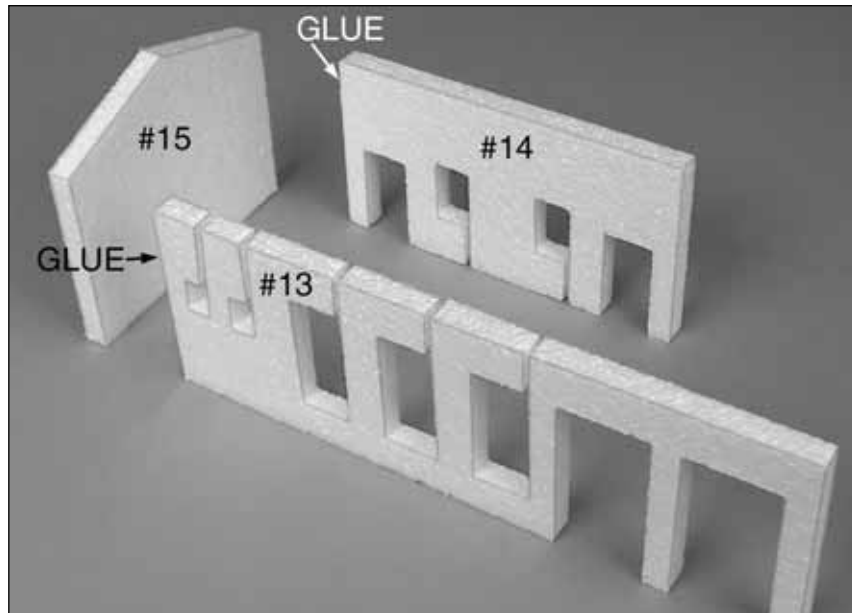
7. Glue the sections from step 6 onto the main building (#2) as shown below. Glue the #8 section into place so that the doorway is centered. The #9 sections should be glued into place 1/2" on either side of the #8 section (see photo).



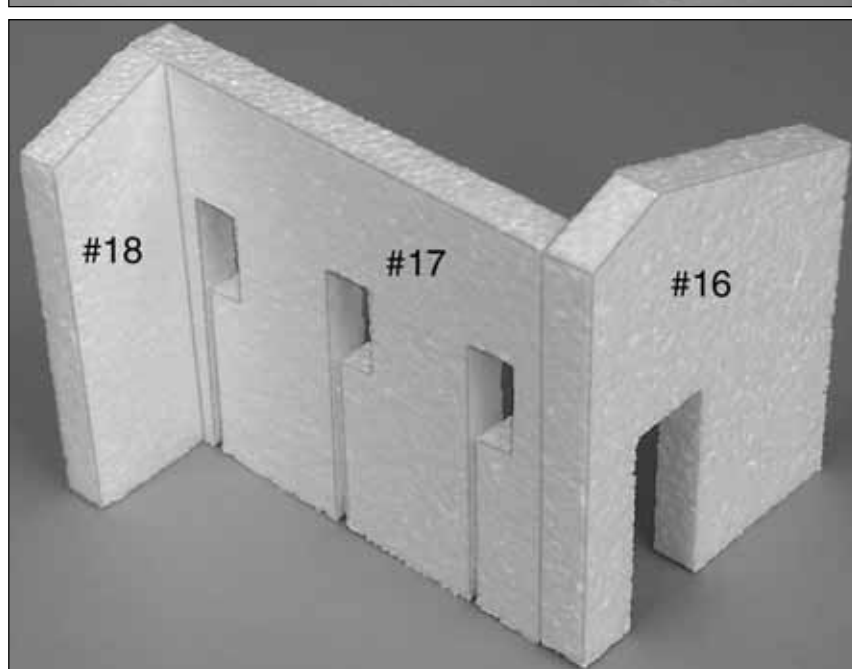
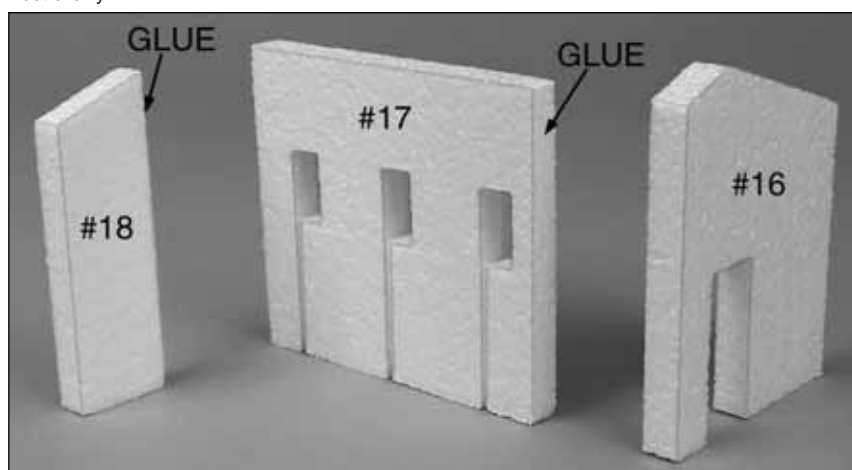
8. Glue both #10 pieces to #11 as shown below. This assembly can then be glued to the front doorway. Glue #12 above the doorway as shown.



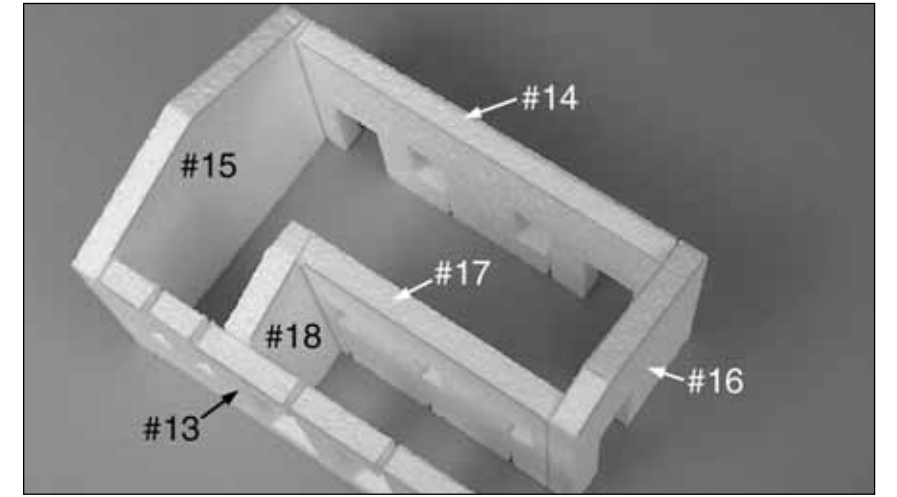
9. Apply glue to the end of #13 (note direction) and #14. Place them against #15 as shown below.



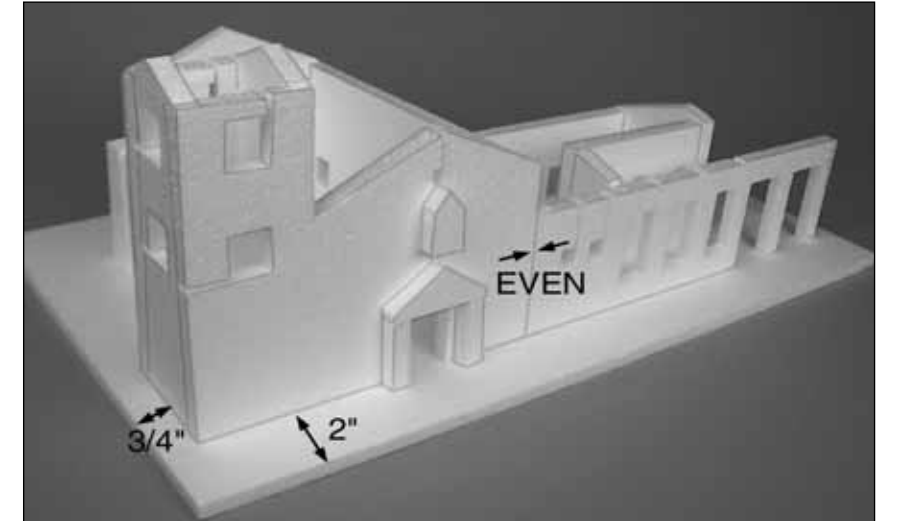
10. Locate pieces #16, #17, and #18. Glue them together as shown below. Make sure that the edges meet evenly.



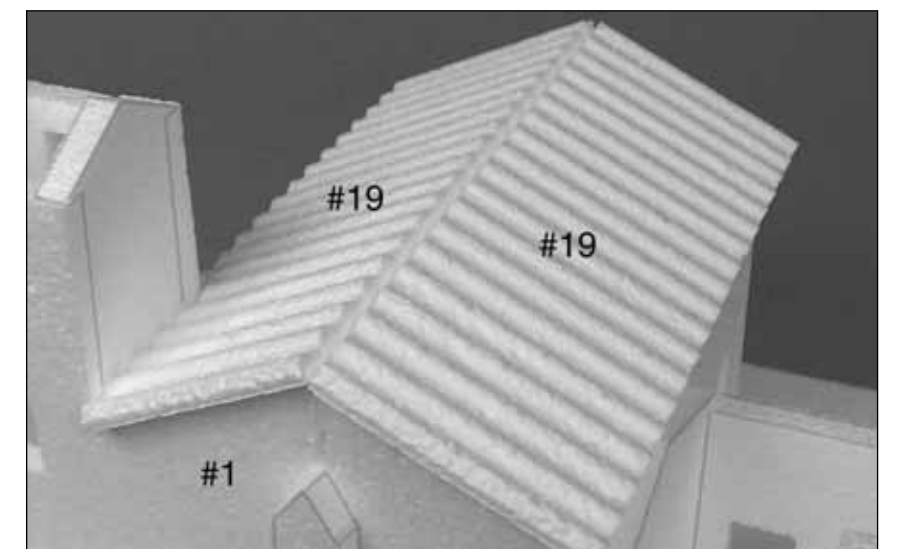
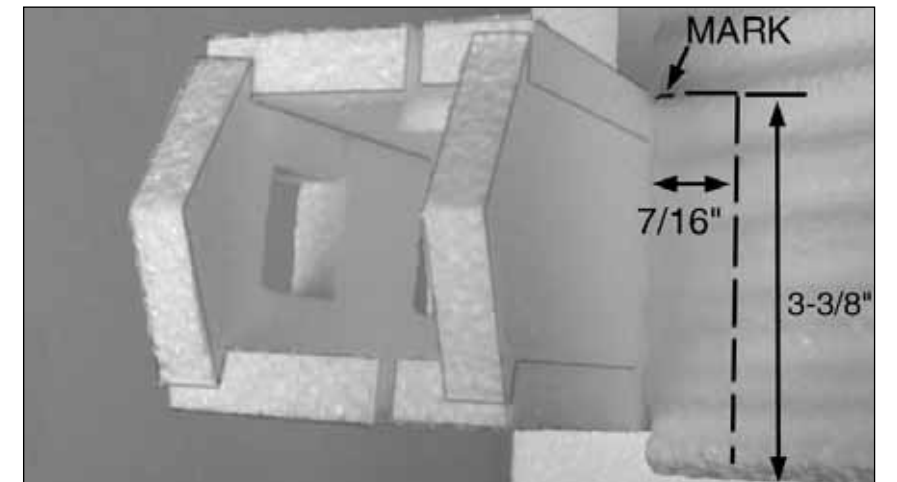
11. Glue the sections from step 9 and step 10 together as shown below. Make sure all edges are even. This section will now be called the "quarters."



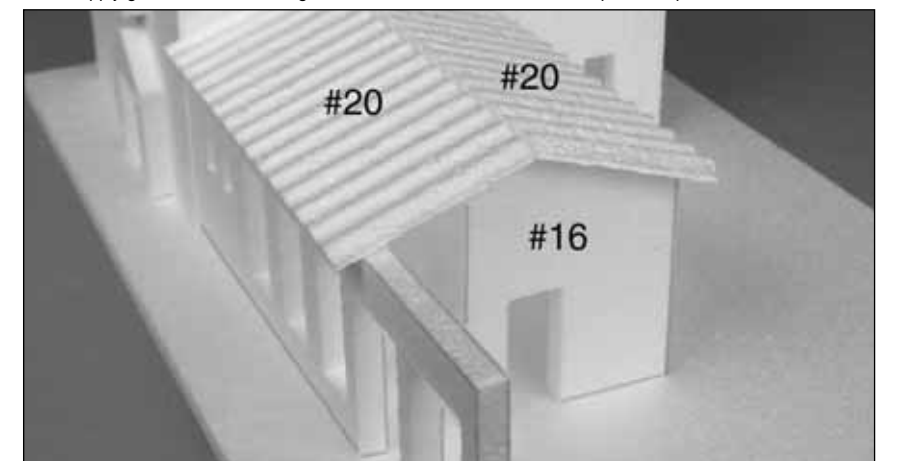
12. Now that the basic sections are complete, they can now be glued to the base. Glue the main building in place so that there is 2" from the front of the base to the front door. The left side of the main building should be 3/4" from the edge of the base. This will leave you enough room to create scenery for your model. Glue the quarters in place so that the left side is up against the main building. The front walls of both sections should meet evenly, as shown below.



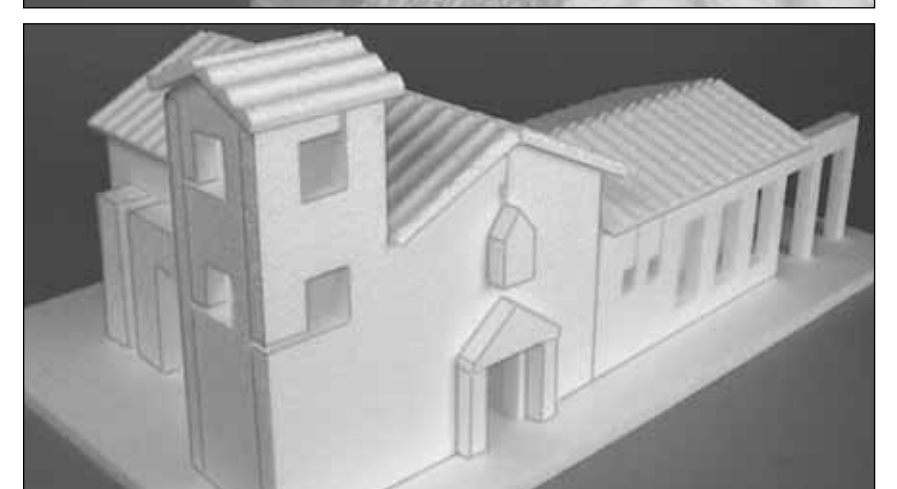
13. Locate both pieces of #19. This is the roof of the main building. You will need to cut a small portion off of the left roof piece so that it will fit tightly against the bell tower. Put the left side of the roof in place so that there is 3/8" overhang on the front and back. Make a mark where the bell tower meets the roof. Using scissors, cut away about 7/16" of away between the marks and the front edge of the roof as shown below. Apply glue to the roofline edges of #1 and #4. Put the #19 pieces into place as shown.



14. Apply glue to the roofline edges of #15, #16, and #18. Put the #20 pieces in place as shown below.



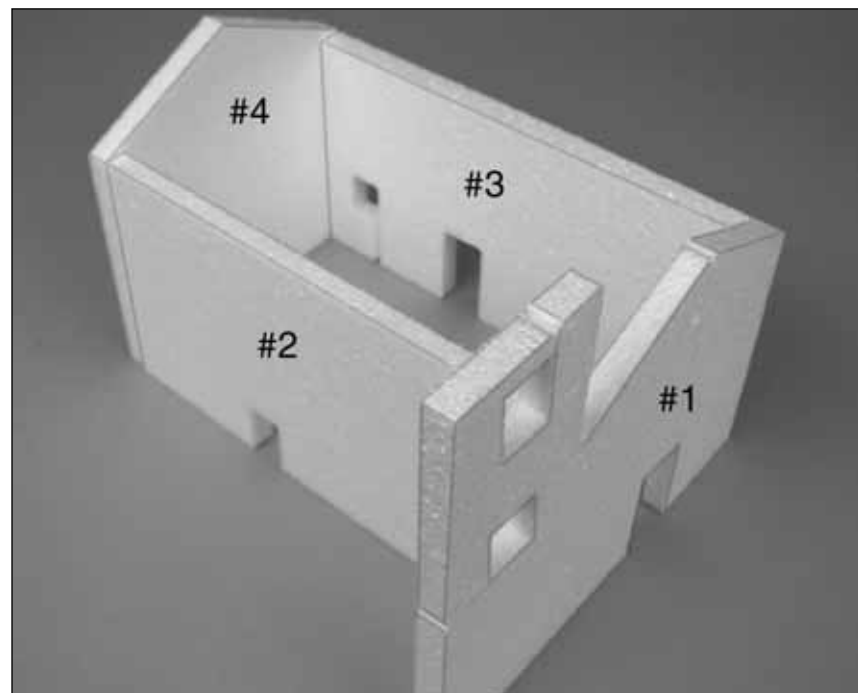
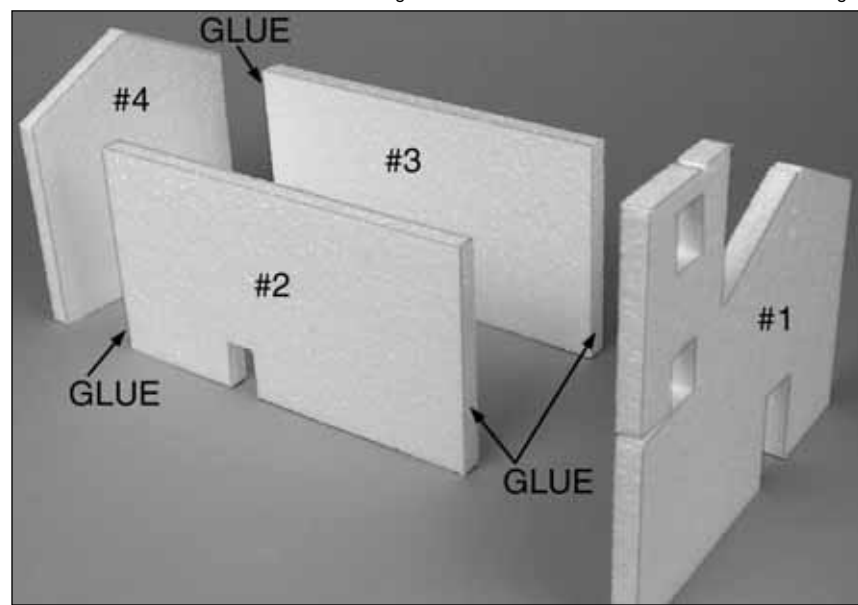
15. Apply glue to the roofline edges of #5 and #7. Put the #21 pieces in place as shown below.



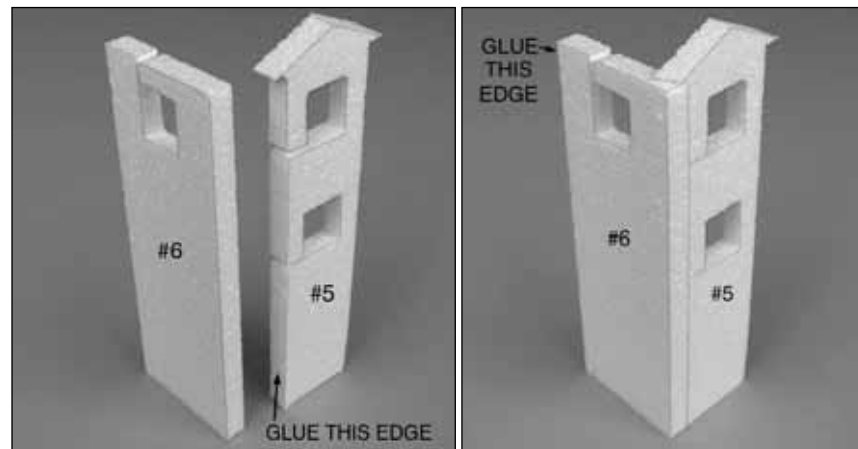
ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place the 24" x 15" base on a clean, flat surface.

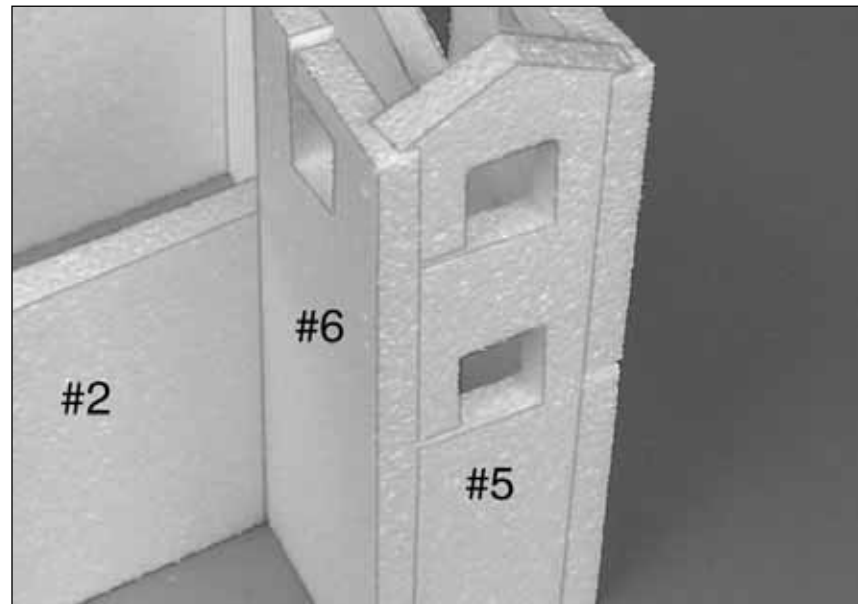
2. Apply glue to the front and rear edges of both #2 and #3 pieces. Put #1 and #4 into place as shown. The left side of #1 will stick out. Make sure all other edges are even. This section will be called the "main building."



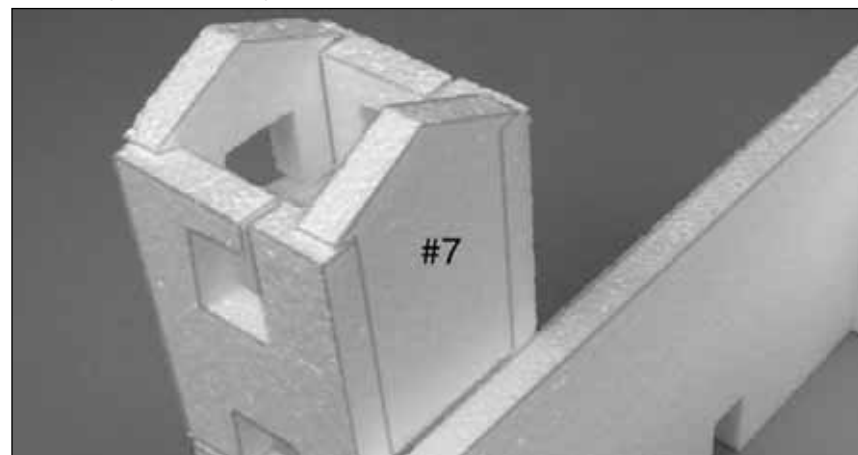
3. Glue #5 and #6 together making sure the edges meet evenly. This part of the main building will be called the "bell tower."



4. Glue the bell tower into place against the main building (#1) as shown below.



5. Apply glue to the side edges of #7 and put it in place as shown below.



FINISHING

- When you paint your model, use only water-based paints.
- Check with your favorite hobby dealer for accessories such as grass, shrubbery, grave markers, action figures...etc. that will add realism to your model.
