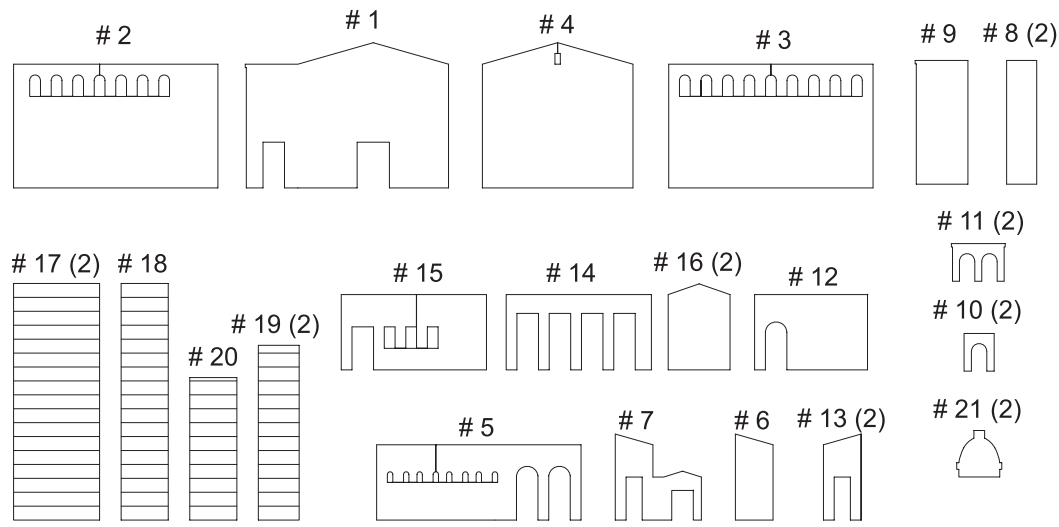

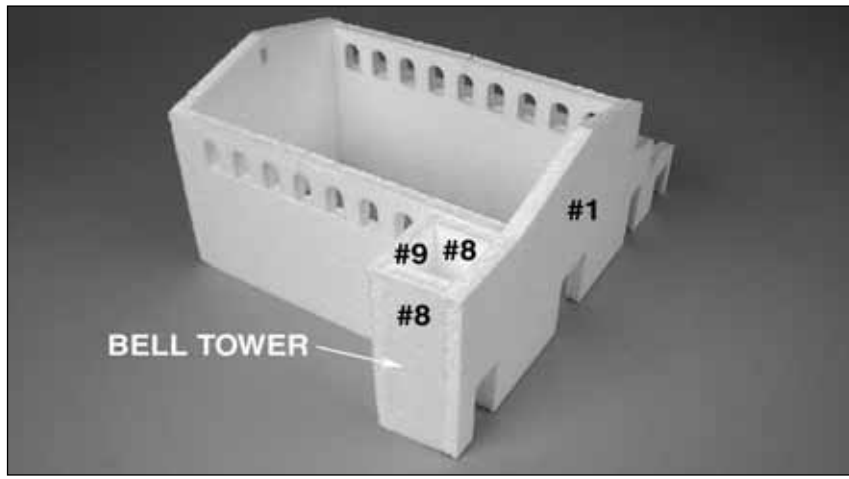
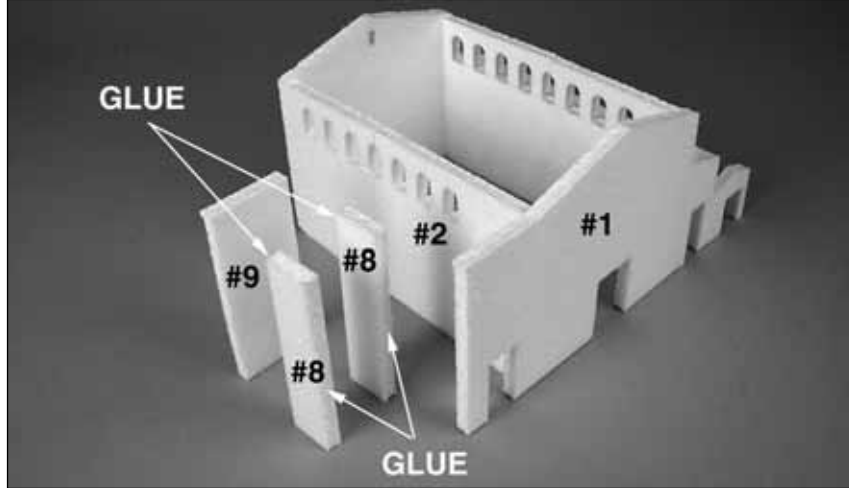
Parts Drawing



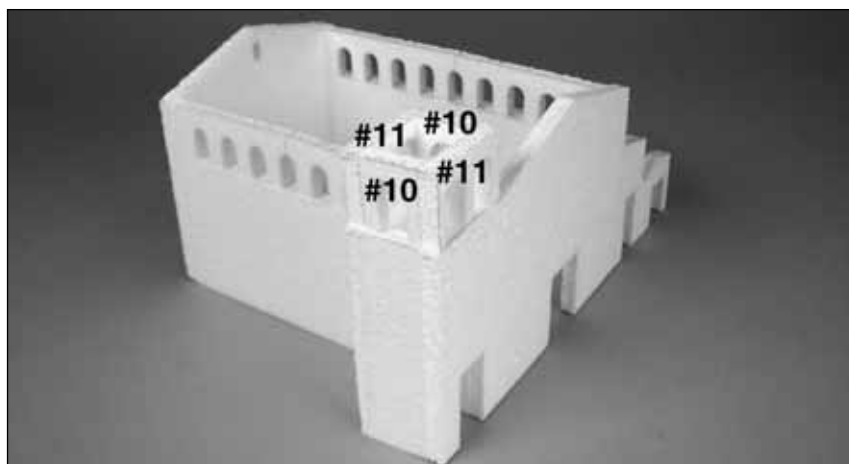
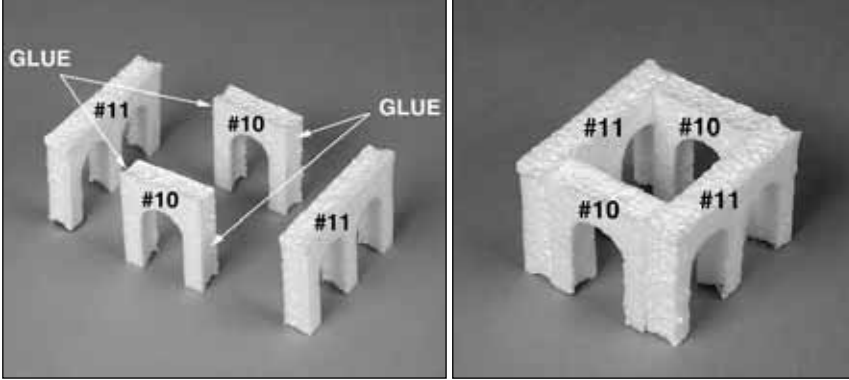
- Before starting assembly, read through each step of the instructions and carefully study each photo. As you put the model together, it is a good idea to "test" fit the pieces together before using any glue.
- Spread out newspaper across the table or desk that you are working on. This will help to protect your work surface.
- Use scissors to trim any pieces where needed. PARENTAL SUPERVISION is recommended.
- Identify each piece of the model by matching it with the parts drawing above.
- Assemble the model with standard white glue. It is a good idea to hold the pieces together with toothpicks until the glue is dry. Once the glue is dry, twist the toothpick and carefully pull it out.
- Use a small brush, flat stick, or your finger to spread glue evenly on the surface.
- Do not glue any of the pieces to the base until after Step 8.

Note: The missions can either be assembled on the cardboard sheet (included) or on a sheet of foam (not included).

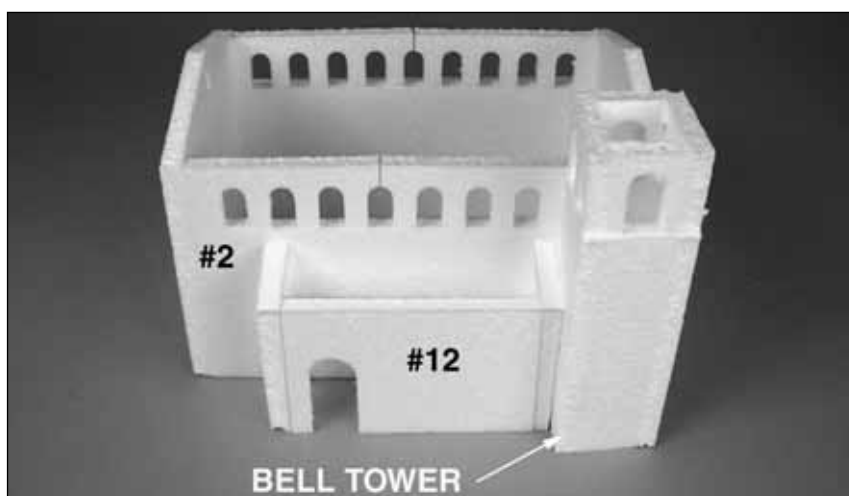
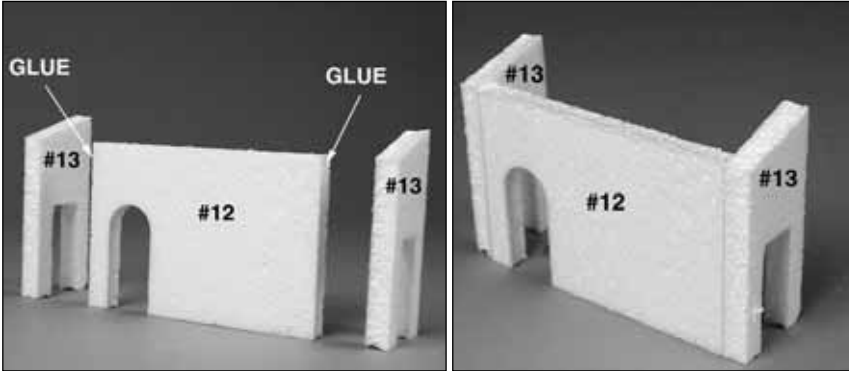
- 5. Apply glue to the side edges of both #8 pieces and put the #9 piece in place as shown. Put this section in place against #1. Make sure all edges are even. This part of the main building will be called the "bell tower".



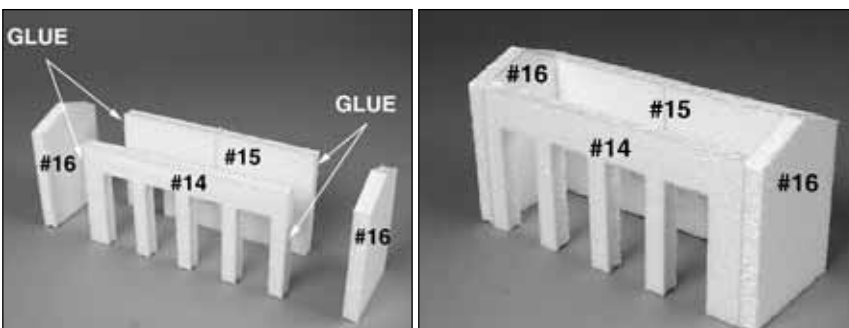
- 6. Apply glue to the sides of both #10 pieces and put the #11 pieces in place as shown. This section can then be glued into place atop the bell tower.



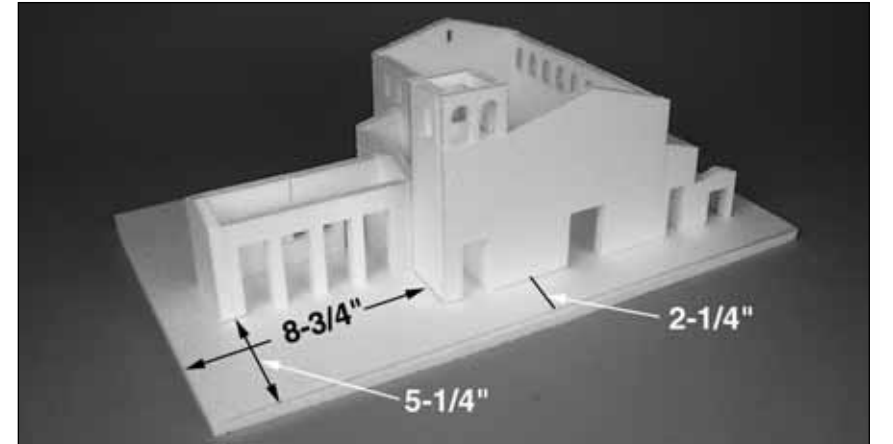
- 7. Apply glue to the side edges of #12 and put both #13 pieces in place as shown. Apply glue to the tall edges of both #13 pieces and glue this section to the main building, against the bell tower, as shown.



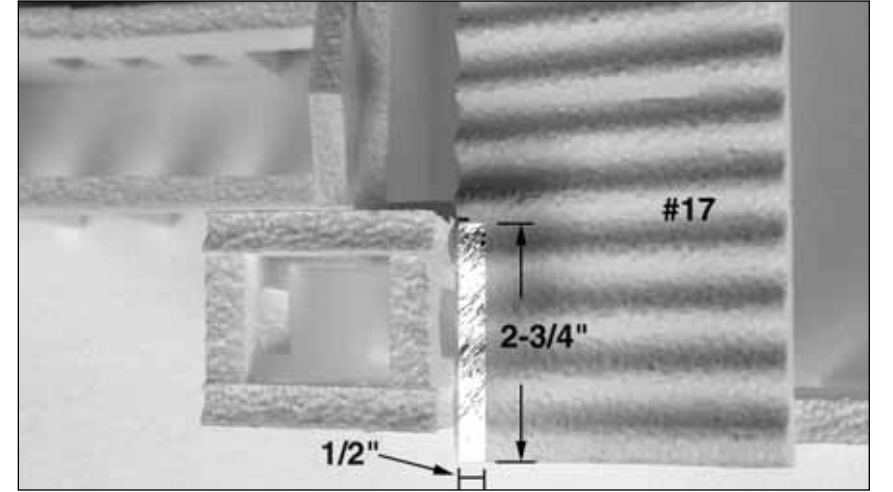
- 8. Apply glue to the side edges of pieces #14 and #15. Put both #16 pieces in place as shown. This section will be called the "patio".



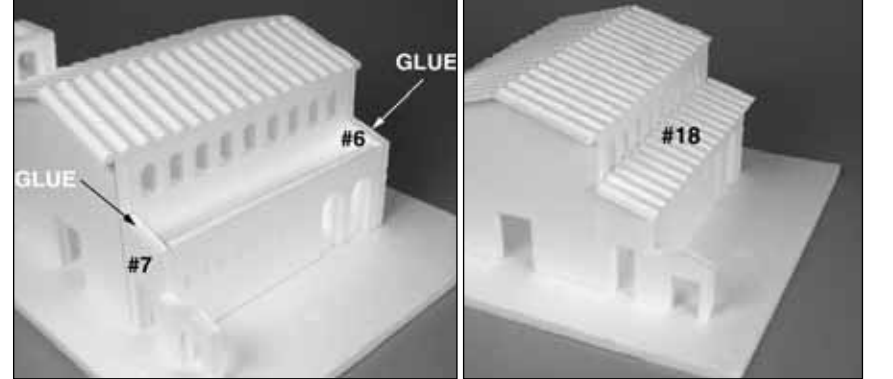
- 9. Now that the basic sections are complete, they can now be glued to the base. Glue the main building in place so that there is 2-1/4" from the front of the base to the front door. The left side of the bell tower should be 8-3/4" from the side of the base. This will leave you enough room to create scenery for your model. Glue the patio in place so that the right side is up against the main building and the front wall is 5-1/4" from the front of the base.



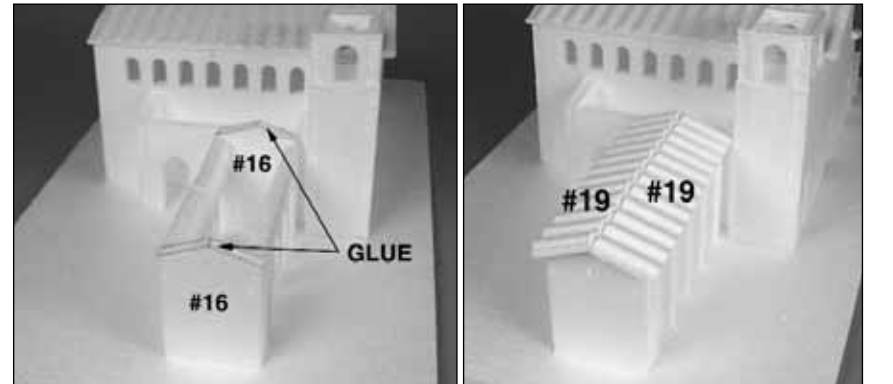
- 10. Locate both pieces of #17 roof material. This is the roof of the main building. You will need to cut a small portion off of the left roof piece so that it will fit tightly against the bell tower. Using scissors, cut away about 1/2" in and 2-3/4" up from the #17 roof piece as shown. Apply glue to the roofline edges of #1 and #4. Put the #17 roof pieces into place as shown.



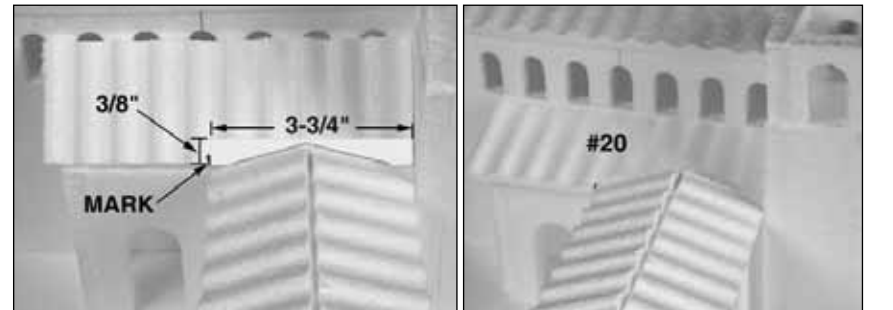
- 11. Apply glue to the roofline edges of #6 and #7. Put the #18 roof piece in place as shown.



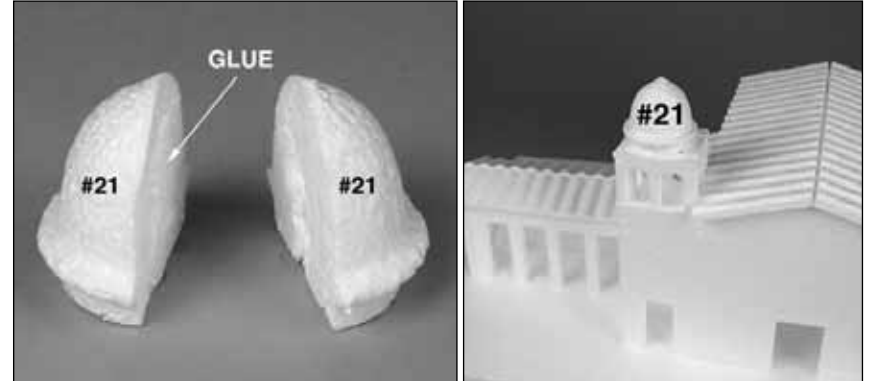
- 12. Apply glue to the roofline edges of both #16 pieces. Put the #19 roof pieces in place as shown.



- 13. You will need to trim the #20 roof piece in order for it to fit properly. Put the piece in place and make a mark where it meets the patio roof. Trim 3/8" away from the mark to the front edge of the #20. Apply glue to the roofline edges of both #13 pieces and put the #20 roof piece in place as shown.



- 14. Locate both #21 dome pieces and glue them together as shown. Glue it in place atop the bell tower.



FINISHING

When you paint your model, use only water-based paints.



Check with your favorite hobby dealer for accessories such as grass, shrubbery, grave markers, figures...etc. that will add realism to your model.
