


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SAFETY WARNINGS:


- 1. The treble hooks included in the fishing lure kit are **EXTREMELY** sharp. Handle with caution.
- 2. The small beads and weights are potential choking hazards. Keep out of reach of children.
- 3. The fishing lures should only be used for their intended purpose of catching fish.
- 4. Only fish while under direct adult supervision.



INCLUDED ITEMS:

- 1. Spinnerbait skirts (3)
- 2. Metal spinner blades (3) 7. Small plastic beads (6)
- 3. Treble hooks (3)
- 6. Large plastic beads (9)
- - 8. Stirrup clevis (3)
 - 9. Spinner bait shafts (3)
- 4. Brass weights (6) 5. Bullet weights (3)

- **ASSEMBLY GUIDE:**
- 1. Straighten one end of the spinner bait shaft out.
- 2. Slide the small bullet weight onto the shaft.
- 3. Squeeze the other end of the spinner bait shaft so that the bullet weight can slide over the end of the shaft forming a loop.
- 4. Slide on the weight so that only a small loop is left in the end of the shaft and then bend the small piece of the spinner bait shaft over to secure the weight in place.



- 6. Install the spinner blade onto the stirrup clevis so that when it is installed the bulged portion of the blade faces out.
- 7. Install one small and three large plastic beads.





- 8. Install one of the large weights with the concave side facing the plastic beads.
- 9. Install the spinnerbait skirt as shown.
- 10. Install the remaining large weight onto the shaft.

- 11. Form a loop on the end of the shaft and install the treble hook.
- 12. Squeeze the end of the spinner bait shaft so that the large weight can slide over the end of the shaft against the loop.
- 13. Fold the small end of the spinner bait shaft to secure the weight in place.

OPERATION GUIDE:

- 1. Tie the end of your fishing line onto the loop with the bullet weight.
- 2. Cast your spinner bait into the water and reel in.
- 3. It may help to use varying techniques of reeling in to find what works best.

The way to a fish's stomach is through his eyeballs, and fishing lures are objects that resemble foods that fish might find attractive. The purpose of the lure is to use movement, color, and vibration to attract the fish and get it to bite the hook.

CAUTION! Hook is sharp!

Spinners are one of the more complicated lures available consisting of several parts. A wire shaft forms the spine of the spinner, and it has loops at both ends: one for attaching your fishing line and the other for the hook. Spinners can be made up of colored beads, metal rings or cylinders that sparkle and shimmer. A waving skirt of material may help gain the fish's interest also. Near the top eye, a flat metal oval is attached to the shaft. This oval is called a spinner blade. The spinner blade spins around the body as you reel in to gain the fish's attention.

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
